Who are we?

The Reducing Pollution Through Partnership (RPTP) Conference is part of the broader RPTP project, coordinated by JNCC. JNCC is the public body that advises the UK Government and devolved administrations on UK-wide and international nature conservation. This project aims to scope and help design a wider pollution programme to enhance the ability of low-income countries to manage chemicals and to reduce air, chemical, and waste pollution. Overall, the main aim of the programme is to reverse biodiversity loss, build ecological resilience in face of climate change and improve human health. Our priority during this scoping year is to engage with pilot countries to understand how to better deliver a fit for purpose pollution programme in the future.

What are we collecting and using your information for?

We are collecting and storing your name, email address and organisation data in order to keep you informed about the Reducing Pollution Through Partnership project and related events and resources. This may be because you have previously expressed an interest in receiving communications relating to the project or have been involved as a stakeholder. We will keep your information for this project until you tell us otherwise or we receive a notification that our emails cannot be delivered (email 'bounces' in Mailchimp). We will not use these mailing lists for any other purpose.

Owing to your previous interaction with the RPTP project, we may contact you regarding activities and resources related to the project. This includes workshops and events designed to bring stakeholders together to share knowledge.

We are currently organising a virtual conference as part of the Reducing Pollution Through Partnership project. For the virtual conference, we will collect the personal data of presenters and attendees in order to organise the event. We may share a list of delegate names with other attendees for information but will not publish it online. We often record such virtual events, and a recording may be published, along with the name and contact details of presenters where consent has been given. We will destroy all personal data we hold relating to attendees for the purposes of organising the event within one year of the event.

Please note, data collected for the event and for the project are managed separately so opting out of contact relating to the event will not remove you from the project mailing list. To opt out of the project mailing list, please contact shauna.narine@jncc.gov.uk.

Categories of personal data

No special categories of personal data will be collected, except in the event that you expressly contact JNCC to notify the team of an access requirement relating to an event we are organising. In this scenario, the personal data given to us for the purposes of organising the event will be destroyed within one year of the event.

Where we got your data

Your data was obtained through the start-up stages of the project where we held workshops to help identify areas and ways of working. You would have either been part of our initial stakeholder consultations to share knowledge or would have been listed as a contact in a pilot country or signed an agreement with us to be an official project partner. All data obtained has either been collected with your express consent or via your organisation or their publicly accessible website if they are involved in the project.

Where are we storing your information and will we share it?

We will store the information you provide in Mailchimp which can only be accessed by permitted staff. Please note that Mailchimp may transfer and process Customer Data to and in the United States and anywhere else in the world where Mailchimp, its Affiliates or its Sub-processors maintain data processing operations. Data stored for the purposes of running the virtual conference will be retained for up to a year. Data stored for project purposes will be kept until you tell us otherwise or we receive a notification that our emails cannot be delivered (email 'bounces' in Mailchimp).

Your rights and our contact details

You are entitled to access any of your personal data which we hold. If you wish for us to send you a copy, please contact dataprotection@jncc.gov.uk with as much detail as possible on the information you would like us to provide and we will respond within one month.

You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data. You also have the right to request that we restrict or stop processing, rectify or delete your personal data.
